Cervical Cancer (Pap Smear, HPV Testing)	Ask your doctor	
Sexually Transmitted Disease (Chlamydia, Gonorrhea)	Ask your doctor	
Cholesterol	20 and above (ask your doctor)	
Colon Cancer (Colonoscopy, Sigmoidoscopy, Stool Test)	50 - 75 (ask your doctor)	
Depression	Annually (ask your doctor)	
Hepatitis B	Ask your doctor
